“You can’t imagine my surprise,” Hill said with a laugh. “My first thought was, ‘Wow, we can use this.’ In fact, the money has been put to good use, helping to pay for food this month.”

Board of directors members were as pleased as Hill, hoping that this donation will encourage others to join in.

“A gift like this is such a tribute to a person whose life was made more joyful not only as a volunteer, but perhaps as a client and the personal contact by the volunteer who brings the food,” board member Barbara Tucker said. “Perhaps others will match dollars, but no matter how large the donation, every gift will make a difference.”

In addition to donations, TCMOW is looking for volunteers, both in the kitchen and for delivery. Twin Cities Meals on Wheels serves more than 100 meals daily to shut-ins, homebound and the elderly in North Tonawanda and the City of Tonawanda.
